St. Michael offers a multi-student discount of \$500 per each additional student per family. Financial assistance and scholarships are available.

St. Michael High School uses FACTS Tuition Management Services to collect tuition and other charges. There is **no interest charge** for any payment schedule when making payments through FACTS. There is a one-time annual fee addressed per family for the use of FACTS as follows:

FACTS Fee for annual/semi-annual tuition payments: **\$25**

FACTS Fee for quarterly/monthly tuition payments: **\$55**
