Classes Resume

Classes resume on **Monday**, **January 5**. This is a late start day; the **tardy bell rings at 8:49 AM**. This is the first day of our second semester.

Attendance Reminders

Students who miss any portion of the school day — including late arrival, early dismissal/check-out by a parent or guardian, or absence for an entire day — are required to submit a handwritten note or a doctor's note to the front office, unless the absence was preapproved by administration.

If a note is not received within three (3) days of the student's return to school, or if the absence is unexcused, the student will receive a consequence, which may include Saturday School Detention.

This requirement will be added to the attendance policy outlined in the Student-Parent Handbook on pages 21-23.

Second Semester

The first semester is complete and report cards were posted on December 29. Please take some time in the first few days of the new semester to discuss with your child his/her academic progress. If grades are not where they should be, please make a plan to improve during this second half of the school year. Seeking help from the teacher, the lunchtime Math Lab, or the National Honor Society lunch tutoring sessions is a good place to start. These resources are available for all students to get the assistance they need. Please feel free to contact your child's teachers or grade level counselor to discuss how we can work together to help your child be successful this school year.

There will be NO school on **Monday, January 19** in observance of *Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day*.


Celebration of Mass


Baton Rouge March for Life


