From The Principal

Seek the truth. Live the faith. Serve like Christ. These are not just words written on the pages of our St. Michael High School Handbook, but they are a call to a way of life through service to others. The goal of our Christian Service Program is to instill in our students the truth that as Christians we are put on this earth to be of service to those in need. The goal for our students is to realize this is not a high school program but a lifelong path to embrace God's call to serve.

Our freshmen begin their service at St. Michael by writing cards and letters throughout the school year to elderly shut-ins. Some of the letters sent by our students go unanswered. This type of service helps our students understand that service is done to help those in need and not in order to receive something in return. This early exposure to the nursing home ministry has led one of the seniors to form a program called "Friends Across the Ages." She recognizes that the elderly can sometimes experience loneliness and feelings of depression so each month she organizes a trip with other student volunteers to a local nursing home to do arts and crafts, to play bingo, and to sing and dance. This senior recognizes there is joy in doing service for others.

Many of our students get their service hours during their summer break. Several of our juniors and seniors spent part of this past summer at The Franciscan Experience, where their volunteer activities included service at Sweet Olive Cemetery, Baton Rouge's oldest black burial grounds. They encountered a cemetery with many graves that were in disrepair and most of the area was overgrown with weeds. When the students returned to school, they planned their own day to work on Sweet Olive Cemetery. Almost 60 students, teachers, and parents spent one warm fall Saturday with weed eaters, rakes, and shovels helping to bring dignity back to the gravesites of those who have come before us. Although the task was overwhelming, the workers that day demonstrated a commitment to make a difference in their community. The students are planning to return to the property this spring to continue the clean-up efforts.

and sisters participate in the National March for Life. This past January was the first opportunity we have had to attend in person in over 2 years. One junior student said that she had never had an experience before where she felt a connection with Jesus. This trip was life changing for her as she felt God's presence throughout the trip, in the experience and in the people she encountered. "I didn't want our pilgrimage to end." Another student remarked "being with young people who are also struggling and vulnerable but accepting of their faith helped to deepen my relationship with Christ." Many of our young men and young women were skeptical about what the trip would entail but after just a few hours into the long bus trip were convinced that they had made the right decision to attend. Although St. Michael High School sponsors and does the planning and preparation for this trip, students from throughout the Diocese are invited to participate.

As our St. Michael High School community moves forward into the future, we work to recognize that we are here to make a difference, to make the world a better place. Thanks to the example of our dedicated teachers and parents, our students see that they are blessed with God-given gifts and talents, and they willingly share them with others.

shopping in stores, go sit

down and eat in restaurants, we had to learn to work virtually and our students had to learn how to learn from home behind a computer screen. One of the biggest things we had to learn to do without was human interaction.

At St. Michael, we teach the importance of having a servant heart and community service is something that is a big part of each of our student's lives. As you can imagine, during the Covid-19 pandemic, face to face commenty service had to come to an end. When we were able to return to school in the fall of 2020, students had to get creative in ways that they could give back and participate in community service without human contact. Our students participated in many food and clothing drives and created a pen pal system where they would write letters to the elderly who reside in nursing homes. Finally, after a long hiatus, our students can travel out into the community and complete their service hours in person.

Since the mandate has lifted, our cheerleaders have spent the day at a special needs day program in Walker, LA, our basketball team has helped restore

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houses with the Habitat for Humanity, and students have been volunteering their time all over our community. One student of ours has gone above and beyond the call of duty when it comes to giving back and that student is Senior Makayla Bonanno. For her senior project, Makayla has made it her mission to work towards helping elderly poverty both physically and spiritually and has created her own organization at St. Michael to help give back.

Makayla has created her own organization at the school called "Friends Across the Ages." Friends Across the Ages is an outreach program that focuses on volunteering time with the elderly at nursing homes once a month. Over 35 St. Michael students volunteer alongside Makayla. Makayla plans a themed visit every month and have activities, crafts, music, and games to go along with the monthly theme all of which she pays for out of her own pocket. Members of our band attend the visits to play music for the nursing home clients and Deacon Michael Parker is almost always in attendance and leads adoration to end the visit. Each visit lasts about two hours. This month's theme is Mardi Gras and Makayla and her team are hard at work planning another festive visit.

We are so thankful for the giving hearts that our students have and that our world has healed enough to have our face to face contact again.



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
